

COSTUME DESIGNERS GUILD AWARD RECIPIENTS

Costume designers have been honoring their own since 1999 with the annual *Costume Designers Guild Awards*. The black-tie gathering before 800 costume designers, industry executives, celebrities, and media honors costume design excellence in five categories for theatrical motion picture, television, and commercials, which are voted on by the Costume Designers Guild members. Inductees' career highlights are presented in a montage that is introduced by a celebrity presenter.

Distinguished members are selected by the Costume Designers Guild executive board to receive honorary awards such as the 'Award for Career Achievement in Television' and 'Career Achievement in Film'. The Guild also recognizes the importance of collaborators with the 'Distinguished' honors, which selects a specific collaborator such as a director, producer, or actor to honor each year. This selection is always tied specifically into the designer award winners.

At each ceremony, costume designers are inducted into the Costume Designers Guild Hall of Fame. The Golden Age of Hollywood designers have been honored, the *Designers of the Twenties* in 2003, the *Designers of the Thirties* in 2004, and in 2005 we will honor *Designers of the Forties*. Contemporary designers are also inducted each year into the Edith Head Hall of Fame. The 2005 Edith Head Hall of Fame recipient is Ruth Morley.

The upcoming President's Award will be presented to Debby Reynolds, and the award for Career Achievement in Film will go to Anthea Sylbert, while the Career Achievement in Television will go to Robert Fletcher.

The Costume Designers Guild Awards are considered one of the hottest and most coveted tickets during the awards season that runs from January through to the Academy Awards® at the end of February. The event attracts high-quality sponsors such as *Bulgari*, *Invicta*, and *Lacoste*.

Academy Award® winner Anjelica Huston (for Prizzi's Honor) has served as Mistress of Ceremonies for five of the first six Costume Designers Guild Awards. She is scheduled to make her sixth such appearance on Feb. 19, 2005. Ms. Huston is also a five-time Emmy and a three-time BAFTA nominee.

Each winner of a Costume Designers Guild award receives a sterling silver statuette provided by the famed Italian jewelers *Bulgari*, conceived to look like a woman draped in silver fabric and designed by Costume Designers Guild member David LeVey. The statuette reflects a mixture of neo-classicism and 1940's Hollywood glamour and is the most sought-after statuette in the world of awards.
